## Emis on-line user access for Under 16's

It is a legal requirement for GP practices to enable patients to access their medical record on line.

The practice will allow parents or guardians to use Emis online access for their children up until the child's 13th birthday. After that it will be removed until the child requests access for themselves.

Emis on-line user access passwords are generated on request and then must be collected from the surgery .
